WITH OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

Rawhide's Occupational Therapy (OT) services help children, youth, and their families who have physical, emotional, sensory, and/or cognitive impairments gain increased independence and confidence in their daily lives. Many of these youth come to Rawhide needing assistance working through trauma, illnesses, injuries, and/or disabilities that significantly impact their quality of life.

Through our comprehensive assessment process, our occupational therapists adapt the environment, activities, and/or tasks to fit each individual's specific needs. Our program has a dedicated therapy room filled with various activities and equipment to help each client work toward and accomplish their individual goals.

Rawhide also integrates CHAPS Equine-Assisted Therapy into our OT sessions, making for an incredibly unique experience as an additional therapy tool to meet the needs of every youth.

Occupational therapy is available with a physician's referral at our Fond du Lac and New London Counseling Centers.



WHY OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY?

- 1** Occupational Therapy puts the client in charge by creating client-centered goals and tailoring the treatment plan specifically to meet each individual's need.
- 2** Occupational Therapy helps promote and facilitate increased independence.

- 4** Occupational Therapy helps to reduce dependence on public services.

Youth who have an opportunity to benefit from the incorporation of equine into their OT sessions, include individuals with sensory deficits, sequencing difficulties, fine motor deficits, attention disorders, initiation issues and more.

Youth will benefit from this unique pairing through various equine activities, such as grooming, painting, obstacle courses, general horse handling and safety.

BRENT HAS A LIFE-CHANGING EXPERIENCE

AT RAWHIDE

The first time Brent heard an Eminem song, he realized he had a passion for music and writing songs.

"I just really admired certain lyrics and the way he put rhythm and rhyming to connect the words," Brent said. "I wanted to create something like that someday."

Brent had always wanted to learn guitar and used to listen to his dad's CDs. One day, his dad told him that his late mother's favorite artist was Eminem. Everything came full circle for him and he realized where his love for music came from. It inspired him to start writing lyrics to songs. His uncle then gifted Brent his guitar, even though he never played it.

When Rawhide began its summer school program, Brent took advantage of the opportunity to learn how to finally play the instrument. It was four 1-hour sessions followed by daily practice in our Young Life Program Manager Mr. Jared's office any chance he got.

Mr. Jared and Brent talked about offering lessons to some of the other youth interested in learning guitar and offering it as an extracurricular.

"When I write songs and play the guitar, it helps me put my feelings that are hard for me to understand into words," Brent said. "I mostly write about feeling sad, hopeless and angry. But making music takes a lot of weight off my chest and helps me understand what I am feeling. It helps me cope with a lot of the emotions I have."

Rawhide doesn't just offer healing services like therapy, school and a safe place to live, we also provide life-changing opportunities these youth would not have experienced otherwise.



"I feel like I really inspired other kids to want to learn to play guitar when they would see me practicing," Brent said.

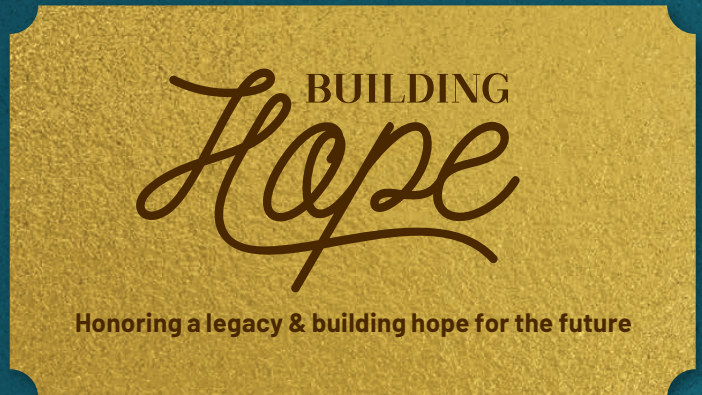
